

- **2.** is a stone or wooden slab, generally taller than it is wide, erected for funerals or commemorative purposes.
- **5.** artwork seperated in lines similar to a comic book for narrrative purposes.

- **1.** gold that has been hammered into extremely thin sheets and is often used for gilding.
- **3.** Crescent shaped region between Tigris and Euphrates. Very fertile soil in an otherwise arid desert.

- 8. instrument like a harp but has a U-shaped frame
- **10.** ornamental, made by embedding a different material into a void that is flush with surface.
- **11.** a central city and its surrounding villages, which together follow the same law, have one form of government, and share languages, religious beliefs, and ways of life.
- **13.** The use of different sizes for powerful or holy figures and for ordinary people to indicate relative importance.
- **14.** for writing, a small tool for mark-making on pottery usually.
- **16.** Group of buildings used for living and governing by a ruler.
- 17. earliest known systems of writing, usually "wedgeshaped" marks on clay tablets

- **4.** in receding tiers upon a rectangular, oval, or square platform, the ziggurat was a pyramidal structure with a flat top. Sun-baked bricks made up the core of the ziggurat with facings of fired bricks on the outside.
- **6.** Figure an image created as a devotional offerring to a deity.
- 7. a deep purple and black shiny stone
- **9.** Assyrian, a bull/lion/eagle combo that is a protective guardian figure.
- **12.** is a musical instrument of the percussion family. It consists of a handle and a U-shaped metal frame, made of brass or bronze.
- **15.** the branch of art history which studies the identification, description, and the interpretation of the content of images.
- **17.** a fortress protecting a town.
